PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Members:

As many of you may be aware, the board of directors, acting on the advice of the professional management company, opted to close tot lots in an effort to reduce the spread of Covid-19. The Association's management office, the Karen House, remains closed to in-person visits. However, the on-site property manager and maintenance and grounds supervisor have been deemed essential employees by the professional management company. This designation will limit the impact to The Jonathan Association operations. The board of directors is closely monitoring local, state and federal guidance on Covid-19. Please watch for changes to the annual calendar.

There are several high member-impact projects scheduled for 2020. As spring gets into full gear, so will spring clean-up. The board of directors approved transitioning monument and common area spring clean-up from direct-hire to a professional services model. I anticipate the transition will result in work being completed faster, a reduction in training time and ensure landscaping and maintenance are completed by an expert. Other 2020 projects include improvements to the Acorn Park at Autumn Woods, Neighborhood 9 monument enhancement, completion of the Lake Grace Pavilion and landscaping enhancements near Lake Grace.

PROJECTS IN 2020

NEIGHBORHOOD 8 CLUSTER MAIL STATIONS

The Association will be installing new lockable cluster mailboxes in N8. Once these new mailboxes are installed, letters will be sent to all N8 homeowners with instructions how to obtain keys for the new mailbox.

NEIGHBORHOOD 9 MONUMENT SIGN

Upon completion of the N9 monument, planning will start for the other eleven monument signs to be completed.

REFRESH NEIGHBORHOOD MONUMENT LANDSCAPING

The Association has contracted Prescription Landscaping to maintain the neighborhood monument signs gardens. Once we have replaced a monument sign, we will be replacing the flowers at each new sign.

REFRESH CENTER ISLANDS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

The grounds crew will be working with Prescription Landscaping to design a new plan to improve the look of our center islands and neighborhood entrance islands. We plan to keep the design simple, yet beautiful. This project will be started this year and will continue until 2021.

COMMUNITY GARDENS TO OPEN AT KAREN HOUSE

The Association is working with vendors to get the gardens completed in a timely manner so that our members will be able to start growing in May. If you are interested in a garden plot, please contact The Jonathan Association.

SILO SIGNAGE

The logo design needs to be replaced with different material. We are working with vendors on updating the silo logo. We will be keeping the same logo, just updating the material. Currently, the logo is a vinyl graphic, which is wearing out and needs to be replaced.

TRAIL UPGRADES

Quotes have been requested for upgrading the Henry Park trail to pavement.

The trail along the lake, that leads to the pavilion, will be repayed.

Vendors are working with the association to pave the City of Chaska's class 5 trail from the Warner Circle stairs, connecting with the city trail. (Seeking City of Chaska approval.)

WARNER CIRCLE STAIRS REBUILD

In order to rebuild these stairs on Warner Circle, The Association is working on an agreement over the land with the City of Chaska.

ACORN PARK REDESIGN

The Association is working with Midwest Playscapes to redesign the two tot lots at Acorn Park in Autumn Woods. Input was received from a town hall meeting, last fall, as to what kind of equipment to put in place.

TREE REPLACEMENT

The Association will be replacing twenty trees within the community, mostly around the Clover Field neighborhood.

TREE AND BRANCH REMOVAL

The grounds crew has been working with a vendor to identify dead trees and tree branches that are hanging over the trails. This is a very long and expensive project as we have many large cottonwood trees that line the trails.

MAIL HOUSE REPAIRS

The grounds crew will be fixing-up mail stations, this summer. Over the next couple of years, the goal is to update all neighborhoods with locking cluster mailboxes and phase out the mail station houses.

I know many of you have felt as overwhelmed as my wife and I. Like you, some of our children and friends have been laid off their jobs. We have all gasped

as our financial nest eggs have cracked and yes we also had to cancel our big anniversary trip in April. (33 wonderful years and four happily married children later, we are still madly in love) You see the studies show that the longer this



VIOLATION LETTERS

During the fall neighborhood inspections, there were over 650 trash bin violations.

If you have received a garbage bin violation, there are many ways in which you can correct it. Storing the bins in your garage is the easiest solution. If you are unable to store your trash and yard waste bins in your garage, then privacy fencing (right) is an inexpensive way to enclose them from public view. Some homeowners have planted a climbing vine, such as clematis, alongside lattice fencing. All privacy fencing should match existing property elements, according to ARC guidelines.
